American Red Cross	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In dire need of blood donations • Still focusing services on home fires
The Arc	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Day program closed in coordination with public schools • Other programs, activities, and events suspended • Will provide updates and online resources for families • Will continue to check-in with families by phone
Avalon	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suspending non-essential activities • Continuing shelter operations
Bacon Street	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suspending in-person operations including teen drop-in centers • Providing telemedicine for clinical services • Prevention services postponed in coordination with schools
Boys and Girls Clubs of VA Peninsula	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clubs closed in coordination with public schools • Deep cleaning and sanitizing sites in the meantime • Providing information to the parents re educational activities • Provided 3 sites for NNPS grab and go lunches • Waiting for approval to serve grab and go dinners at clubs
Catholic Charities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have closed two offices, but working to maintain services otherwise • Case managers still delivering supplies • Providing mental health services by phone • Guardian staff dropping off supplies to public • Modified financial services to minimize gathering and contact

Center for Child and Family Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In-person services suspended • Employing telehealth services
Child Development Resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Childcare Centers closed • Large training events canceled through March
Downtown Hampton Child Development Center	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Center closing at 3pm instead of 6pm, and limiting classroom size to 10 students • About 40% of regular students currently attending • Need: Cleaning wipes
Edmarc	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Still doing home visits, reducing routine in-home appointments • Canceled fundraising and family events • Suspended in-kind donations
Girl Scouts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Canceled meetings and events • Exploring options for virtual programming
Gloucester Mathews Care Clinic	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rescheduling non-critical appointments • Eliminating in-person eligibility appointments • Cannot test for flu/COVID, so triaging and referring • Postponed annual fundraiser to July
Habitat for Humanity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All offices and stores closed • Working remotely with homeowners and applicants • Planning to accept applications April 1
HELP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Winter shelter closed for the season • Working to provide pantry items although DSS building is closed to the public • Currently days center is still open

HRCAP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Headstart program suspended, materials online via Facebook and website • Tax preparation services are only being provided by drop-offs or by phone • Housing counseling services being provided exclusively by phone
Housing Partnerships, Inc.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Office closed to the public • Suspended work in homes • Staff available by phone to address emergency needs
LINK of Hampton Roads	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Winter shelter closed for the season • Suspended pick-up and distribution of clothing and housewares • Providing food thru First Call referrals, modified delivery to allow no-contact • Veteran Programs are operational with little exposure to community • Working to provide bag lunches to homeless community in partnership with Four Oaks • Food Pantry distribution M-F 9am-12pm • Need: volunteers to do outdoor work at Vet home
Literacy for Life	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Operations currently suspended • Encouraging volunteers and clients to use online and phone conferencing to continue instruction
Natasha House	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suspended activities • No visitors allowed • Need: Supplies for products
Peninsula Agency on Aging	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offices and dining centers closed, no home visits • Seminars postponed for 30 days • Providing food to participants via Meals on Wheels delivery • Transportation services continued with pre-screening
Peninsula READS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tutor classes suspended • Some learning sessions being conducted by phone • Exploring opportunities and capacity for virtual learning • Will provide printed instructional material for tutors and learners • Need: donations of tablets and hotspots



Salvation Army Peninsula	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Will begin emergency disaster services • Clients still able to request financial assistance in-office • Pantry open M-Th thru First Call referrals • Serving meals daily in Downtown Hampton and Downtown Newport News • Gloucester center closed to public, will deliver food • Need: Canned and non-perishable foods
Salvation Army Williamsburg	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Open to providing food Mon-Fri 9am-4pm • Still open to requests for financial assistance
Smart Beginnings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continuing prenatal screenings • Will provide training and support via online platforms • Training/coaching for childcare providers available online- see website for schedule • Concern for private providers as small business and limited capacity to meet current needs • Working to ensure childcare is available at least for healthcare workers • Local childcare resource referral line providing updates on openings/availability
THRIVE Peninsula	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rent/Utility Assistance coordinated via fax, email, website, and phone • Financial Coaching offered by phone • Providing food thru First Call referrals, modified delivery to allow no-contact (expanded to 21 hours/week) • Need: Food donations
Transitions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 24 hour hotline still available • Rearranged shelter capacity to allow 1 family per unit • Established a quarantine site if needed • No support groups, but counseling provided by phone • Assisting families to retrieve school packets • Accepting donations of cleaning supplies for shelter and families
Versability Resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Day Support programs closed • Deploying staff to cover program homes and commercial contracts • Early childhood services provided by phone • Concern for over 200 employees with less than 40 hrs PTO



VA Peninsula Foodbank	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Open regular hours with emergency food requests by appointment only • Planning a mass distribution in NN and Hampton • Mobile Food Pantries modified to be low- to no-contact • Providing backpack meals at open school sites • Kids café open with bag lunches instead of hot meals • Seeing significant decline in volunteers • Postponed annual fundraiser till June 4
Williamsburg Faith In Action	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suspending rides and services until re-evaluating on Wednesday • Staff will shop for groceries for seniors • Need: Toilet Paper for seniors
YMCA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closed operations and site activities for two weeks • Exploring opportunities for virtual exercise activities • 3-4 emergency childcare sites will be open for Riverside and Bons Secour

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
